Treasurer's Report of 2017-18 Operating Budget

In September, we had a deficit of \$296.22; the amount collected from offering was about 60% of that collected in previous months. We still have a significant surplus year-to-date resulting from prepaid pledges recorded in July.

Income came from Stewardship Campaign Pledges (\$14,528.33); Pledges for Previous Year (\$.00); Offering (\$639.00); Fundraising (\$304.25); Other Income (\$3.52).

Expenses were from Salaries and Benefits (\$5,692.80); Minister's Compensation (\$6,585.15); Administrative Expenses (\$35.50); General Expenses (\$3,227.19); and Committee Expenses (\$230.68).

We will honor Veterans' Day with a viewing of *USS Indianapolis: The Legacy*. *The Legacy* tells the tale of the World War II heavy cruiser using exclusively first person accounts. The last crew and their families share gripping stories of kamikaze attacks, invasions, a secret mission, and ultimately a devastating torpedo attack that killed three fourths of the crew. The survivors recall the 5 days they spent floating alone in the Pacific Ocean, their miraculous rescue and how they fought together to clear their captains name. The documentary runs 98 minutes. We'll have treats and drinks for this meeting while we see and hear about this amazing story.

Calling All Youth - Check out YRUU!



Omaha Together One Community (OTOC) Update

Our congregation is a member of Omaha Together One Community (OTOC), the local congregation-based community organizing group. After summer training sessions, OTOC is implementing basic organizing practices to grow and become even more involved in making our area a better place to live in 2018.

Delegates Congress November 13th

A key step is congregation approval of goals on **November 13th, 7 p.m.** at St. Pius Parish Center, 70th & Blondo. Be ready to answer "yes" when someone from our Social Justice Committee asks for your commitment to attend this Delegates Congress.

Action Team Updates

- Environmental Sustainability: The team is focusing on clean water and a transparent bidding process for Omaha's city waste management contracts
- **Immigration Reform:** 3,000 immigrant families from El Salvador work and live among us under Temporary Protective Status. The team is calling attention to the fact that their status is being threatened by the current federal administration.
- Housing and Neighborhood Revitalization: Team members are hosting Housing Stakeholders Conversations to address substandard and rental housing in Omaha. A panel from Family Housing Advisory Services, Omaha Healthy Kids Alliance, and the Heartland Workers Center will speak about issues they have identified on November 8th at 10 a.m. to noon at the Heartland Workers Center, 4923 S. 24th Street.
