# Treasurer's Report

July 2018-June 2019 Cheri Cody, Treasurer

Our fiscal year is from July 1 to June 30. The following pages compare 2018-2019 amounts with end-of-year amounts for 2017-2018 and 2016-2017.

## **Consolidated Balance Sheet**

The Consolidated Balance Sheet shows restricted and unrestricted funds in both the assets and liabilities/fund balances/members equity portions of the balance sheet. The Operating Fund 01 money is held in the checking account or money market account which includes everything except Endowment. This gives comprehensive and transparent reports by showing all transactions. Endowment funds are invested, restricted, and not liquid.

As of June 30, 2019, Checking, Money Market, Account Receivable, Capital Campaign Pledges, and Investment Accounts Balances total \$438,629.54 which includes Restricted Funds of \$416,067.50 (including investment funds) and Unrestricted Funds of \$22,562.04. The Endowment Fund is detailed on the Consolidated Balance Sheet. Investments are comprised of our purchases of Vanguard Group funds and our account in the UUA Common Endowment Fund. Changes in market value are recorded as "Unrealized Gain or Loss" account on a monthly basis on the balance sheet.

A capital campaign was conducted in the fall of 2018 to add accessible bathrooms on the main floor and to replace the parking lot. Pledgers had the option of spreading payment of the pledge over three years and most chose that option. As of June 30, \$171,990.82 had been pledged and \$89,958.78 had been received.

#### **Treasurer Duties and Responsibilities**

The Treasurer is appointed annually by the Board of Trustees. Responsibilities include custodian of all church funds, weekly deposits, bill paying, record keeping for pledges and other contributions as well as financial data analysis, presentation, and retention, disbursements, plus preparing the workers comp audit report and other essential reports. I also administer payroll and ensure that the proper employee and employer forms are completed and payroll is submitted on a timely basis The office administrator, Jaime Short, is responsible for day-to-day activities such as recording deposits, contributions, offerings, and paying invoices. Jaime also performs monthly bookkeeper responsibilities such as making accounting entries, reconciling our bank statements, and preparing balanced financial reports.

◊ Weekly Counters – Clyde Anderson, Kathy Bell, Kathie Haskins, Vicki Pratt, David Johnson, and Mark Siepker. As a team they organize the offering plate contents into pledge payments, Share the Plate donations and other income.

◊ Payroll – I continue to serve as payroll administrator and enter all salary related entries into our account at Paychex to ensure that the minister and staff are paid correctly and on time.

Board of Trustees decision to not be represented at Finance Council meetings hindered clear and direct communications and decision making. Lack of Board representation at 2019-2020 Budget Team meeting impeded shared understanding of fiduciary responsibilities, transparency, and financial sustainability.

Achievements:

- Managed the 2018-2019 Budget of \$220,327.
- Held 12 regular Coordinating Council meetings.
- Gathered paperwork to present to Banks during interviews for acquiring loan/mortgage/line of credit for the Property Improvements.
- Treasurer set up accounting and record keeping for Capital Campaign pledges and receipts, and invoice payments for the \$175,000 indebtedness approved by our Congregation on November 4, 2018.
- Updated procedures for How to Handle Offering and Pledges since there are now two types of pledges: Capital Campaign and Operating Budget.
- Wrote process steps for creating 1-year annual Operating Budget. Thanks to Clyde.
- Managed contract with Vanco to set up processing to accept electronic offering and pledge payments. Payment by text rolled out first; more functionality to follow. Thanks to Anita Meyer and Kathy Bell.
- Managed transition of paying dues to MidAmerica Region and Unitarian Universalists Association of Congregations as a percentage of our Annual Operating Budget instead of the long-standing fee per congregation member.
- Decided to stop selling Fair Trade coffee, chocolate, and other items as a means of fundraising. Interest has decreased over the years as brick and mortar and online vendors offer socially responsible merchandise.
- Moved important church history papers from basement storage to bank safety deposit box: Dodge Fund Agreement; letter acknowledging Second Unitarian's membership in Omaha Together One Community.
- Established expectation for developing 2-year and potentially 5-year budgets as part of process for creating annual 1-year Operating Budget.
- Refilled the envelopes inside hymnals for use to identify and categorize offering given during services.

Thanks to steadfast, reliable, and diligent volunteers who prepare the weekly offering for deposit: Clyde Anderson, Kathy Bell, Kathie Haskins, Vicki Pratt. Alternates: Mark Siepker, David Johnson.

The Major Donors event that has traditionally served as a way to kick start the Stewardship Campaign had to be postponed several times due to blizzards and icy driving conditions. The event was eventually cancelled.

Future Goals:

• Encourage Board of Trustees participation in Council meetings to re-establish communication and smooth decision making.

Summary of the past year's achievements:

• The committee has historically chosen a different recipient for Share the Plate each month. In January 2019, the committee decided to change the Share the Plate organization to every two months, rather than every month.

- Each year OTOC congregations conduct an internal contribution campaign where letters are sent to a targeted group of members in the congregation. The letters are signed by members of the OTOC Core Team within Second Unitarian Church. This year \$1360 was donated by Second Unitarian members for Omaha Together One Community's Individual Contribution Campaign (there were 17 donors)
- The social justice committee, as in previous years, donated a gift basket to the OTOC auction valued at \$75. The basket had items relating to racial justice along with comfort items such as coffee, chocolate and wine.
- The Open Arms Transgender Social Group (OATS) did background checks for 6 facilitators and put on a "Volunteer Orientation" for facilitators.
- The committee sponsored an OTOC training about how to conduct House Meetings and held several House Meetings with congregants (during First Hour, the TUUesday Circle/Retirees group, etc.,) for people to talk about issues important to them.
- Through OTOC, members helped gather signatures to put Expanded Medicaid on the general election ballot and it was approved.
- Practiced social witness by displaying banners on the church building supporting Black Lives Matter and Compassionate and Just Immigration Reform.
- Participated in Pride Parade
- Managed the community garden and provided ground tilling and water for the 14 community plots.

Future goals:

- To better educate the congregation about OATS and other things the social justice committee is doing the committee plans to post articles in the weekly church newsletter.
- To work more on building relationships with other people and organizations, rather than focus single-mindedly on "issues."
